his work, titled Moses and the Pillar of Cloud, is a bold and evocative composition that showcases the signature intense color and intricate detail of Lucas Cranach the Elder's celebrated oeuvre. The remarkable 16thcentury oil on panel by Lucas Cranach and his studio captures the narrative moment when Moses leads the Israelites out of Egypt and encounters God manifested through a large pillar of cloud. Moses stands at the precipice of a bridge and turns back to soldiers helping to lead the group of Israelites who huddle closely together. Cranach depicts Moses with his traditional iconography, rendering the rays of light on his head which came to be interpreted as "horns" in the translation of the Bible. Using his traditional walking staff, Moses gestures toward the pillar, seemingly acknowledging that God will protect the group as they cross the bridge to the other side, leaving exile and entering a promised land.

In a nod to Cranach's Germanic locale, he renders the figures and setting in a manner that feels decisively more akin to European aesthetics than those of the Red Sea. Soldiers wear elaborate, gothic suits of armor that recall the livery of Northern European guardsmen. The terrain appears more like a European forest giving way to a sweeping valley than the arid landscape the Israelites trekked through on their journey across the Red Sea. Though still clearly recounting a story from the Old Testament, Cranach renders the cast of characters and setting in an earthly, familiar manner. This aesthetic shift speaks to Cranach's own changing beliefs as he found himself at the center of the Protestant Reformation.

After first gaining recognition in 1505 as the official painter of Frederick the Wise, Cranach established a thriving painting and print studio in Wittenberg, Germany. Cranach was renowned for his court portraits and genre paintings and was also well known for his association with the famous protestant reformer Martin Luther, then under the protection of Frederick

the Wise. As Wittenberg became a bastion of new religious thought, Cranach soon befriended Luther and played an active role in creating the printed materials that proliferated throughout the Reformation.

Cranach worked with his sons and many assistants in order to spread the ideas of the Reformation through his prints and artwork. The Protestant faith famously renounced what they deemed the overthe-top iconographies of the Catholic Church, and Cranach's artwork toed the line of representing the narratives of the Bible without soliciting the worship of icons. Cranach's works both captured the message of the scripture while also rendering bright, luminous colors and exacting details that enchanted 16th-century patrons and continue to make a lasting impression today. Lucas Cranach the Elder's works can be seen at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the Kimbell Museum of Art in Dallas, Texas, the Kunsthistorisches Museum in Vienna, the Kunst Museum in Winterthur, Switzerland, the Thyssen-Bornemisza Museo Nacional in Madrid, the National Gallery in London and the Getty Museum in Southern California.

This work is accompanied by a handwritten letter from a Cranach expert, Dr. Dieter Koepplin certifying the merit and quality of the work. Koepplin writes, "I consider this painting with Moses and the Cloud Column to be a very lively, high-quality work from the workshop of Lucas Cranach the Elder, created around 1525-1530. The state of preservation is excellent."

Letter by Dr. Dieter Koepplin

This astonishing painting illustrates Chapter 13 of the Book of Exodus; as Moses led the Hebrew people out of Egypt where they were living in servitude, the Lord appeared by day in the form of a cloud to show them the way, while by night a pillar of fire appeared (Exodus, 13:21). God appeared to Moses among these clouds and left him instructions. The pillar did not depart from before the people.

Cranach depicts Moses in a manner consistent with traditional iconography: old, with a stick and rays of light surrounding his head sometimes interpreted as horns. As usual, the artist focuses his technique on the rendering of the materials. Moses' flowing, delicate clothing contrasts with the plain and shiny metal of the armour and the abundance of vegetation. The composition is organised in two parts; on the right, the men are gathered behind their guide while on the left, the space opens towards the sea to make way for the pillar of cloud. The latter is a theophany, a manifestation of God, who appears bearded and with curly hair, encircled by a halo. The horizonal format, which Cranach was particularly fond of, allows him to integrate a narrative into his painting. With his stick, Moses points to the pillar from which God is sending his message. This type of historiated composition can be found in the panel dedicated to *Abraham and Isaac* from the Kunst Museum in Winterhur (Fig.1).

The highly graphic style of Lucas Cranach accentuates the strong lines. Thick black contours outline the clouds and Moses' curls. A similar technique is used by the artist to represent vegetation. Every blade of grass is highlighted by a pale line of colour. On the right, pine cones glimmer like lanterns and light the way for the soldiers. By staying close to nature, the artist anchors his story in a landscape, which doesn't play the leading role, but serves as a framework.

Cranach is appreciated for his majestic portraits, his sumptuous ornaments and his Venuses with mother-of-pearl skin. The reason he chose this passage from the Old Testament is because it echoed his political and religious convictions. Cranach used his painting to defend the ideas of the Reformation. Here, the subject alludes to the education of the free and modern man, released from his shackles. Placed in the centre of our composition, Moses is about to cross the bridge to another shore, representing the escape from exile. From Luther to Samson (Fig.2), Cranach likes to represent the freedom of man. Moses, however, is rarely depicted in his paintings. Two examples where he does appear are Moses and Aaron with two Prophets in Munich (Fig.2) and Moses and the Ten Commandments (Fig.3).

In Cranach's time, the world evolves quickly, and his exceptional inventiveness is marked by traces of these changes. His works were collected by both Catholic and Protestant patrons. In addition, this panel is a perfect example of the incisive clarity characteristic of Cranach's art, whose brilliant colours and quality of drawing still surprise us today.
